


Special: CPR-BLS Instructor Course Just for Cary CERT 8/19, 9AM-5PM, Wake Tech

June Training: After you Stop the Bleed

Cary CERT vice-president George Dolicker presented a next-steps, hands-on practical session on what follows initial START triage and the immediate life-saving interventions of ensuring an airway, stopping severe bleeding, and arresting severe shock: bandaging wounds. Sixteen CERT members learned or refreshed their skills using a triangular bandage to treat patients head-to toe with 14 different bandaging techniques.

This year was Cary CERT's first participation in amateur radio field day where FCC licensed members demonstrated our capabilities with the trailer, updated our Wouxun handheld radios with the latest configuration, and demonstrated that an HF radio and antenna could be set up and communicating worldwide in under 30 minutes without reliance on commercial power. Lots of members, families, friends, and neighboring CERTs got their first chance to talk on an HF ham radio and experience the excitement of making a ham radio contact with new friends far away.

IS-505: Concepts of Religious Literacy for Emergency Management

Religious and cultural communities are key partners in building a culture of preparedness. Faith-based and community organizations also offer a wide variety of human and material resources that can prove invaluable during and after an incident. As CERT members we will be collaborating with these vital community members and organizations during responses in times of emergency. This 4-hour on-line independent-study class will help facilitate interagency operations and cooperation with these other organizations.

As CERT nationally moves towards position credentialing through the National Qualification System (NQS) to facilitate team mutual aid across the state and nation, this four-hour independent study class fulfils one of the seven course requirements for the "CERT Volunteer – Type 1" personal credential.
