May Training: ICS System al la Cary Spring Daze

14 members attended Cary CERT president Julie Carlino's presentation covering the ICS and CERT forms used during the Cary Spring Daze festival and similar deployments at the monthly training meeting at station 9 on May 11. Julie reviewed the 8 standard CERT forms, and then went into detail on the forms that make up an ICS-based Incident Action Plan (IAP) that was the blueprint of how we operated at Spring Daze. She also reinforced the importance of filling out event activity logs with everything that you do during an event: "if you didn't document it, it didn't



happen." These activity reports form the basis of after-action reports and improvement plans for us and for Cary. Julie reminded everyone that they should have a full set of CERT forms in their go-bags.

CPR-BLS and AED Class

12 Cary CERT members and 7 CP CERT members attended the CPR class on May 20th that Wake Tech conducted just for Cary CERT, and all were awarded CPR-BLS +AED certificates from the American Heart Association: CONGRATULATONS one and all, and thanks to everyone who took time out of their Saturday to take this training! CPR is indeed a CERT skill, one of the core skills that CARY FD expects of Cary CERT members, and can save the life of a family member or loved one.
